

St. Clair Township Public Meeting Process – January 28, 2008

Attendees will be assigned a table as they arrive. A brief introduction (about 15 minutes) will be given describing the planning project and the public meeting process. Each topic will then be identified and each table will have newsprint to write on, to record responses to the question: What concerns and ideas do you have for the future of the township about this topic?

There is a time limit for each round. Staff will move the papers from table to table. Scribes for each table will be members of the advisory committee. OKI will have 5 staff members floating (to assist 2 tables apiece) as needed.

Topics

1. Industrial and Commercial Development/Economic Development
2. Transportation
3. Recreation/Open Space, and Cultural Activities (e.g. Libraries, etc)
4. Populations with Specific Needs (Senior citizens, youth, disabled, etc)
5. Environmental Concerns/Issues
6. Education
7. Infrastructure Issues (water, sewer, storm water, police, fire, EMS)
8. Housing
9. Agriculture
10. Source Water

Round 3: 10 minutes

Round 4: 8 minutes

Round 5: 8 minutes

Round 6: 8 minutes

Round 7: 6 minutes

Round 8: 6 minutes

Round 9: 6 minutes

Round 10: 4 minutes

While the sheets of newsprint are placed on the wall, the attendees will remain seated and fill out a ranking sheet. Each person will assume that they have \$100. Participants may allocate the \$100 to any of the 10 topic categories that they wish in any manner.

When the ranking sheets are completed and all the newsprint sheets are displayed, each participant may take ten dots and place them in any manner on the newsprint sheets next to the concerns and ideas that they believe are most important.
