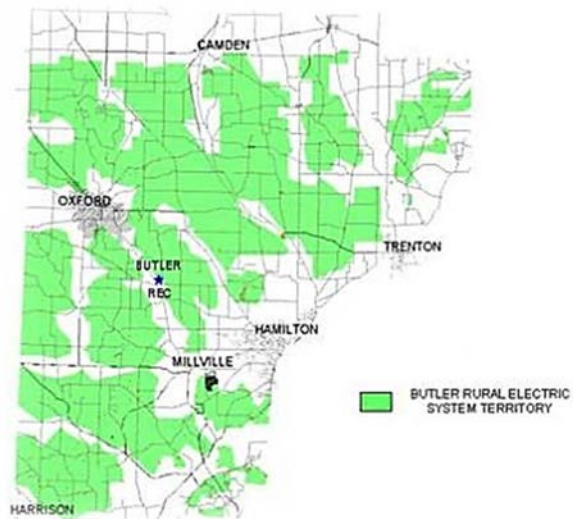
- Provides electric services to over 30,000 customers in the greater Hamilton area.

## Fiber Optic

- Butler County built a fiber-optic backbone network of 96 strands extending nearly 100 miles.
- The Butler County Fiber Network deploys more than 9,000 fiber-miles throughout the County.
- The system connects every community in Butler County to a high-speed broadband network.

## Water

- Butler County's Great Miami River Buried Valley Aquifer System (GMR-BVAS) provides fresh water to residents.
- GMR-BVAS is one of the largest and most productive aquifer systems in the nation.
- The City of Hamilton received a certificate of recognition from the Ohio EPA back in 2015 for **“exceptional implementation of drinking water source protection strategies”**.

## Telephone

- Butler County is mostly divided into three main telephone providers: Cincinnati Bell, AT&T, and Verizon.
